
A Singular Focus



Intensive high performance from Mercedes-Benz models is Hartmut Feyhl's specialty at RENNtech. Many of his customers are club racers who seek brake and suspension upgrades that will work weekends at the track as well as put fun in the daily commute. Feyhl has big plans for the new C-Class, but he says current customer demand is for modifications to the new CL and S models.

Feyhl enjoys a good relationship with his former employer, AMG, which became the tuning subsidiary of Mercedes-Benz three years ago. In fact, Feyhl grew up in Afalterbach, Germany, AMG's home city, and worked for them for 12 years before starting RENNtech in 1989.

RENNtech's goal is to allow customers to individualize their vehicles without compromising the drivability or quality expected of a Mercedes-Benz. "People pay big money and expect to get a car that still has the reliability of a Mercedes-Benz," he says.

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
